

## **Yurok Tribe's Summer 2016 Internship Descriptions**

**Watershed Department:** (High School and Undergrad) 1 Position, 30 hours per week. (College Undergrad) 1 Position, 30 hours per week.

Project: The summer interns will serve as “Environmental Technicians–(E-Techs)” and serve on Bucktail Channel Rehabilitation Project on the Trinity River, near Weaverville, CA. The interns will be responsible for water quality monitoring, which involves taking water samples on a continuous basis within the project site to monitor turbidity levels (water clarity) in the river downstream of construction activities. An ideal intern must be a fast learner, have computer data entry skills, and have the ability and willingness to learn new skills, have the ability to work well with others, have the ability to be flexible, reliable, and enthusiastic. Due to budget constraints, no travel (lodging or per diem) costs will be associated with this position. Therefore, we propose that the position have a condition that the interns live within the Weaverville vicinity (approximately 30 mile radius). Having interns drive from Weaverville to Hoopa or Klamath could be a safety concern after long hours and we would recommend against allowing this type of locality differential for the internship.

**Planning Department:** (College Undergrad) Intern will assist department planners in implementing project goals, including office, program administration, and field assignments. Intern must be able to work well with other staff, other departments, outside agencies, and professionals, be punctual, follow instructions and implement assigned tasks. Intern must be willing to make a commitment to work for ten weeks this summer.

**Early Childhood Education Interns (3):** (high school or undergraduate) one at the Klamath site, one at the Eureka site and one at the Ke'pel site. Interns will get valuable experience if they are planning a career in Early Childhood Education (ECE) in either head start or Child Care. They will get to provide learning activities to the children, see an ECE center in operation, interact with other ECE staff, and get to know policies and procedures of ECE center. An ideal candidate for these internships is someone interested in the ECE field, is willing and to work with children ages 1-5. Be motivated and positive, be punctual, and be willing to commit to ten weeks this summer.

Our Early Childhood Education center must comply with the Indian Child Protection and Family Violence Prevention Act 101-630, Crime control Act of 1990, executive order 12968 Adjudicative guidelines. Background checks are required to work at our ECE center sites.

**Once any of interns are selected through the interview and selection process we will provide a copy of the job description to be signed by the all interns giving an understanding that, as employees, they are expected to perform their assigned duties, and abide by all Yurok policies and procedures—personnel, vehicle usage, procurement, etc., and that any violations of any established policies and procedures may lead to disciplinary measures, up to and including termination. The Yurok Tribe is a Drug and Alcohol Free work place.**
