



YUROK TRIBE 2025 FALL FISHERY HARVEST RULES (Summarized from the HMP)

SEASON: Friday August 15 through November 30, 2025, or until the quota is reached.

TOTAL SUBSISTENCE QUOTA: 1,108 adult Chinook salmon, quota set by the Pacific Fisheries Mgmt. Council.

OPEN DAYS AND HOURS: From 9:00 a.m. Friday through 9:00 a.m. Sunday of each week.

DRIFT NETTING THE CHUTE: Drift net fishing the chute is not allowed. Set nets are not allowed in the chute.

ELDER'S / DISABLED FISHERY: 300 adult fall Chinook salmon have been allocated for distribution to Yurok Tribal elders. The Tribe will not be purchasing salmon this year. Tribal fisheries department staff will be harvesting and processing the fish with help from the Food Sovereignty Program.

TRIBAL GUIDE FISHERY: The tribal guide fishery has been authorized in 2025 under the provisions of the Tribal Fishing Rights Ordinance (FRO). 50 fish have been allocated to the fishery, which will be counted as commercial fish. An annual fee of \$100 will be charged for a guide license application. Tribal guide clients who have purchased a non-tribal member fishing license will be permitted to harvest up to two Yurok fall adult Chinook per day. The two harvested fish must be donated to the Tribal elder's fish program by the Tribal guide within 48 hours. Licenses will be sold to the clients by the guide for a fee of \$20 for each fish for a one-day license. FISH KILL CLOSURE: The Yurok fishery will be closed immediately if there is a determination by the Yurok Tribe Fisheries Department that a fish kill has begun.

COHO PROTECTION CLOSURE: To protect Coho stocks, which have been listed as "threatened" under the Endangered Species Act, beginning Wednesday, September 24 through November 30, all fishing is prohibited from 9:00 a.m. Sunday through 9:00 a.m. Friday and is allowed only from 9:00 a.m. Friday through 9:00 a.m. Sunday of each week, if the fall Chinook salmon quota has not been reached.

HARVEST MONITORING: Yurok Tribal Fishing Rights Ordinance 17.40.060: Each fisher shall display all fish he or she has caught upon the request of an authorized law enforcement official or authorized tribal personnel for the purpose of monitoring the harvest or assuring compliance with the provisions of this title. The snouts of adipose fin clipped salmon must be given to Yurok Tribal Fisheries Program staff upon request pursuant to YTC 17.15.220(d). The information obtained from coded wire tags recovered from such fish is critical to the successful management of Klamath River Fall Chinook.
