**Councilmember Provolt:** Good morning Council, staff and membership. As summer season begins, I would like to get an update on the portable toilets that Council approved to be purchased. Thank you.

**Councilmember Williams**: United Indian Health Services is looking at 4-day work week, however it would mean the Clinics would be open 6 days a week. We're talking about scaling back and they are talking about going the other way. Our membership would actually benefit from this change.

**Councilmember Crawford**: Weather is warming up. I want to give a big shout out to Hoopa Valley Girls Softball team who is doing very well and I encourage everyone to go watch if you get a chance. Lots of tribal members on that team. It's very exciting.

**Councilmember Natt**: Pass.

**Councilmember McCovey**: As mentioned by Councilmember Crawford, warm weather is going to start rolling in and people should start getting fire safe ready. Most of the state has been released from drought conditions but not northern California. In a State consultation meeting I attended the other day, we were notified that within California, 7 counties are out of the drought crisis.

Councilmember Ray: Pass.

**Councilmember Vanlandingham**: Pass.

**Vice Chairman Myers**: We are happy to announce that we received 18 million dollars for restoration in the upper basin. We met with the Shasta Nation and working with them about restoration in the basin. It's very nice to see the fruition that traveling to some of the meetings, we've been going to is finally coming to light. As the weather gets warmer we are going to be tempted to go swimming, but the river is not ready yet. Please refrain from swimming.

**Chairman James**: Summer is around the corner and we need to reach out to our team about clearing out near elders home. We are going to work with our Departments to make sure our elders are attended to and needs are heard. We haven't heard officially yet but we anticipate that our salmon numbers are going to be low and we will be discussing this situation.

# TRIBAL MEMBER COMMENT:

Rose Sylvia:

- Tribe received 62 million for those homes who did not get electricity the first time, and want to be sure those who do not have power are first.
- Going through COVID and having a kid in school, I tried other internets companies. I
  have switched over to the Tribe's internet and I am so happy. But, I have never paid for
  it, so not sure if the billing is going right.

- I see you have not hired a Telecommunications CEO and I think you need to hire the
  best. I think the broadband is a super good idea. You also have never hired a PUD
  Manager, now you have taken that employee and moved them to a corporation.
  - This is health and welfare issues, we need to have a water manager to keep the system going to meet standards.
  - We need a refrigerator for Shaker Church.

- When Rose was fired, Council said they didn't know about it, and that decision was made by the Chairman (Joe). That is not right.
- There are drugs being ran down there (further downriver) and you are not doing anything about it.
