119	Chairman James: I want to thank our Council and Staff. We are working around the clock. We		
120	are submitting grants and one of them for bringing alternative energy to Yurok Country. Our		
121	goal is to provide Microgrid systems first to the reservation and then to ALL Yurok Tribal		
122	members. There was a lot of good meetings, good conversations. We have declared a State of		
124	Emergency for the upper end of the Reservation. We are looking at the health and safety of our		
125	membership. Our efforts regarding Murdered, Missing of Indigenous Peoples has come a long		
126	way. If any staff want to attend the candlelight vigil for May 2, 2023. AB 273 is our Foster Care		
127	Bill that is supported by several Tribal Departments. We are getting more support from other		
128	Tribes, like San Manuel. March 14 is the hearing date for the Foster Care bill. Everyone is		
129	working so hard on this, everyone on the screen and in this room to help our families. We		

130	wholeheartedly support this effort. I want to have letters ready to be signed. The more letters
131	of support we can gather the better, if staff want to do that on their own free will. If we could
132	have those ready by lunch today.

134	TRIBAL MEMBER COMMENT:
135	Nicole Provolt: This comment is to our UIHS liaison, and not so much Council, but I want to
136	share how absolutely ridiculous and difficult it is to get a dental appointment. A person has to
137	call at the first of the month, but appointments are only available for a few weeks at a time and
138	they fill up fast. They should be able to open up their schedules a few months ahead of time,
139	not a few weeks at a time. I have a limited time to see my dentist due to my work schedule, and
140	my dentist is only available certain days of the week. Those appointment fill up so fast that it
141	takes me multiple calls at the beginning of the month to get a appointment. I hope this
142	appointment system can be changed.
