5.0 APPLICATION FEE

The following is the Fee Schedule for a Yurok Tribe Water Quality Permit. These permit fees can be combined. For example, if a project disturbs three acres of soil and includes the installation of a community septic system the fee required would be \$3000 for the Acre Disturbance and \$500 for the Septic Review. Please indicate which fee applies for this project.

- Soil Disturbing activities at \$1000 per Acre of Soil disturbed, at a minimum of \$1000. This should be broken down to tenths of acres, and 100 per tenth of Acre. For example, if the project was disturbing 1.3 Acres of soil, then the fee associated would be \$1,300 dollars.
- Well Permits require a \$500 fee per well.
- Culvert Replacement projects require a \$500 fee per culvert replaced.
- Septic Systems at a \$500 fee per septic system.
