Councilmember Ray: I know this seems to be an on-going issue and I don't know why people feel like the end of the pavement is the dump down in the Glen. Someone started a fire and it took off.

Councilmember Williams: I attended the Fall Fisheries meeting. There was a suggestion that those who fish for the Elders, could be in a raffle (possibly a boat or motor), which could increase participation.

Councilmember McCovey: Pass (internet issues)

Councilmember Vanlandingham: That's one of the better suggestions I heard last night in the fall fisher meeting. I agree.

46 meeting.

50 **TRIBAL MEMBER COMMENT:**

51 Michelle Santsche: Yesterday, was the day I have been fearing and trying to prevent for four
52 years. I came around the corner on Hwy 169 and I knew we were in trouble. The smoke was so
53 thick and large, the winds were high, and the grass is drying out. I had a few minutes to think
54 about this before we got there. I was trying to figure how the five of us were going to put this
55 fire out if we could not get other agencies to come in and help. Even at that it would be 45
56 minutes to an hour before anyone else could get to us. Would we need to evacuate all these
57 places before the fire would reach them? How could we do all of this by ourselves. Everyone
58 probably thought I was this crazy lady, trying to figure all this out! I was angry that no one had
59 listened to me, as this could have been prevented! I talked to Koiya from the Yurok Tribal
60 Environmental Program - he is a very rude and disrespectful. Yes, I was angry as I had written
61 an email last week telling them of the problem on Trinity Way. In talking with him he kept on
62 telling me it was not his problem, it was not on tribal land - it was county property! It is not
63 county property. It is private but what I understand is that the tribe was taking care of it this
64 parcel and had Okayed the dumping. Last year at one of the fires we put out someone was
65 dumping a trailer full of greens and I asked them to stop and leave, but they continued as they
66 were told by Richard Nelson to dump it! They then called Richard and he hunted me down in
67 the Glen and got in my face and said they could dump there and I had no right to tell his
68 employees to stop and leave. The tribe continues to dump there along with the locals. When
69 we pulled up, I was in shock as the fire had traveled to both sides of the road and down the
70 back side over the berm! The flames were as high as the trees heading to Glenn dike which was
71 dry. We immediately called for every agency to come, as we knew we could not put the fire out
72 on our own! We were incredibly lucky Cal Fire was around in CC they got here as quick as they
73 could, but we still had to contain the fire the best we could till then. What people do not
74 understand if there are fires else were, Cal fire is gone, and it is just us! The only reason we
75 were able to get the fire out was because of everyone else's helped with us. We had 3 Cal fire
76 engines 2 chief rigs, 2 alder camp rigs, 2 Crescent City rigs, 3 Klamath fire rigs, 1 Fort Dick, 1
77 Forest Service engine. To let you know how close this fire got it a couple hundred feet from a
78 family's home, who just lost her husband and father-in-law. What more grief could she handle!
79 These people are our tribal members and members of our community. I feel we cannot protect
80 them without the help of the tribe! I have tried my best and no one seems to listen to me, I feel
81 like my voice is not heard or wanted! These fires are filled with toxins, trimmings, furniture, and
82 garbage. These fires are arson there was at least 10 starts of fire by the road. The last time we
83 put the fire out, we all had troubles with our lungs as something was mixed in with everything.
84 It is dangerous as they have boards with nails sticking up along who knows what! If these fires
85 put us out of commission, we cannot respond to medical either. We are volunteers without us
86 you have nothing for 45 minutes and usually longer especially with Last Chance Grade. I do not

87 know what I need to do to get your attention. Go to the people in the Glen, because it is their
88 families, homes and businesses that they will lose in a flash. The dry season is only starting,
89 what if we are not able to cover? We are all volunteers and have lives also, we do the best we
90 can with what we have, which is not much.
